Civil Society Appeal to UN

Through our UN-NGO Office, the Society of the Sacred Heart is supporting a civil society appeal asking UN Member States to hold a special meeting at the Financing for Development Forum in July 2020. We believe (and hope) that by July 2020 it will be possible to review the global response thus far to the COVID-19 emergency and assess what further social, economic and financial policy measures might be adopted at relevant United Nations and other international forums. The Society will be represented at this forum where we will collaborate with other members of civil society to give input. In order to contribute substantively, I will be in touch with the UN-NGO Liaison persons before July to gather information about recommendations from our provinces and countries.

Our starting point is the Gospel with all that it demands from us of love, forgiveness and justice, and of solidarity with those who are poor and rejected by the world, Constitution #7

- 1) **Pray** together for those affected around the world, especially the most vulnerable and their families, all those working in essential services, and decision makers.

- 4) **PETITIONS**: for healthcare, financial help, and debt relief. **Sign this petition** to the International Monetary Fund (IMF) to protect the vulnerable https://www.jubileeusa.org/aa_covid-19_imf_2020_petition (English, Spanish) and https://jubileedebt.org.uk/a-debt-jubilee-to-tackle-the-covid-19-health-and-economic-crisis (English, French, Spanish, Portuguese).
- 5) SUPPORT the EASING OF SANCTIONS: ***Attention all JPIC and UN-NGO Liaison Persons in sanctioning countries please find out which local group(s) that your province or country can support to help ease sanctions that hinder access to basic needs in countries such as Cuba, Venezuela, Iran, North Korea, and Zimbabwe. The UN Secretary General and the UN High Commissioner for Human Rights have pleaded for an easing of sanctions for these and all countries that are struggling to meet basic human needs.
