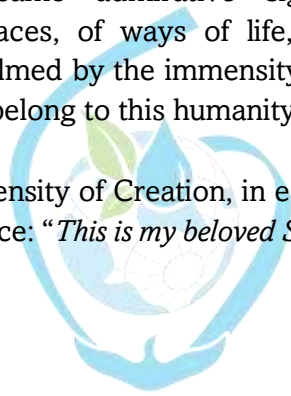
2ND SUNDAY



“The Lord God took Abram outside and said, “Look up at the sky and count the stars, if you can. Just so,” he added, “shall your descendants be.”” (Gn 15.5)

Tracks to Contemplate:

- * Go out, out of my home, out of myself, out of what I know.
- * Take time to look around, for a long time.
- * “Measure” the immensity. Recognize I can’t count, control, master, own nature, and Creation.
- * Look at people with the same admiring sight. Contemplate the diversity of faces, of ways of life, of opinions. Let myself be overwhelmed by the immensity of the people of God. Recognize I belong to this humanity.
- * See the face of Jesus in the immensity of Creation, in each person’s face. Listen to God’s voice: *“This is my beloved Son: Listen to Him.”* (Lk 9.35)



This contemplative attitude permeates our whole being, helping us to live ever more united to Christ in our relationships, our tasks, and our ministry. It becomes a powerful force of conversion and transformation for mission.

In welcoming God’s word Mary gave Christ to the world. In receiving the life of Jesus, we give ourselves with Him so that all may have life...

Echoes from our world: *When children learn meditation at school.*

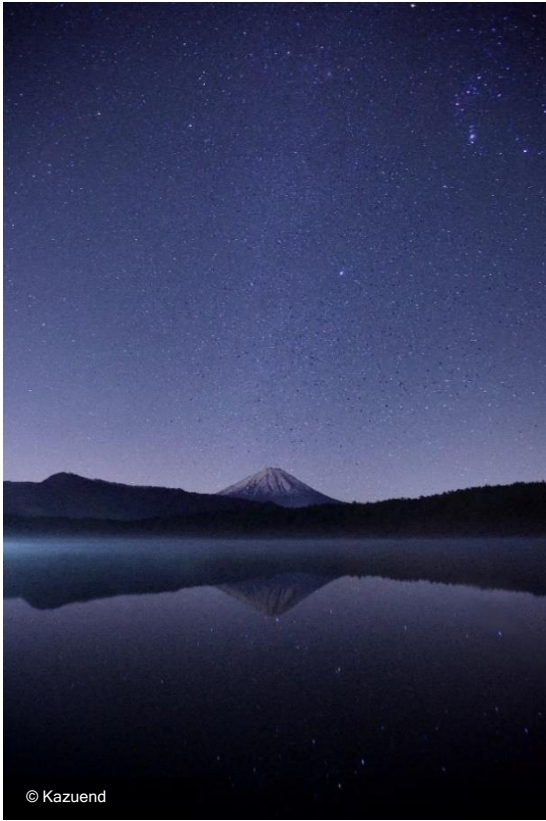


Everyone needs to learn to be silent, first step to contemplation. In many places in the world, meditation is taught to students from kindergarten to high school.

On cloudless nights?

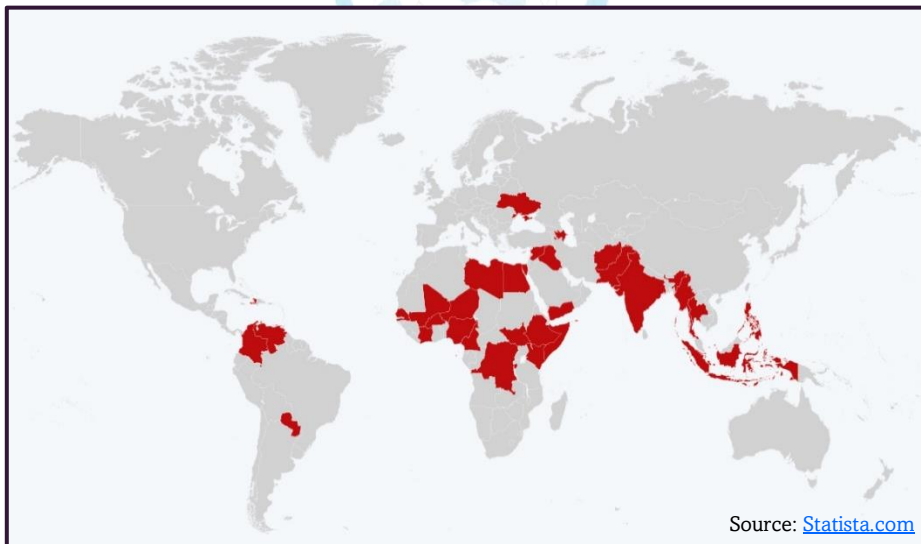
God, who gave them life and splendor,
